All proposals undergo a blind review process and are scored by members of the Annual Conference Program Workgroup. APTA Private Practice makes the final decision to accept or reject a proposal and determines the content, format, and schedule of each presentation.

Overall Quality and Personal Interest	5 = Strongly Agree 4 = Agree 3 = Neutral 2 = Disagree 1= Strongly Disagree	Is the proposal of high quality? Would this be a session you would like to attend?
