

## Abstracts Readiness Self-Assessment for Posters or Paper Presentations

Criteria Used to Judge Abstracts	Do you have this information to include in your abstract?	l am ready!
Basis of inquiry / Intro (Are you hooked?)	You can identify the problem and rationale for chosen direction or approach	
Purpose/objective/Aim (Do they jump out?)	You can clearly state the purpose/objective/aims – this needs to be a sentence that can jump out at the reader	
Methods (What, who, how?)	<ul> <li>You can clearly state how you did your project and these should relate to the purpose/objective</li> <li>If research project: you can describe design, sample, how you measured outcomes, if there was an intervention, what it was, and how you analyzed results</li> <li>If QI/EBP project: you can explain what you did to change a system (the intervention) and how you measured outcomes</li> <li>If educational project: you can describe the educational intervention, who was focus of intervention, and how learner outcomes were measured</li> </ul>	
Findings/Outcomes (What did you find/what does it mean?)	<ul> <li>Logically and concisely stated and relate to stated objectives/aims and methods .</li> <li>If research: Present summary results (outcomes) and comment on how this may influence nursing practice.</li> <li>If QI/EBP: Present outcomes of project and implications for practice</li> <li>If Education: Summarize outcomes of the educational program</li> </ul>	
Content Relevance	Relevant to pediatric hematology/oncology nursing?	

Note: Please ensure that your abstract includes outcomes. If your project is still in progress and you do not have any outcomes yet, consider waiting until next year to submit.
